Jet engine (Access generally) requires explicit use of '#' to delimit date strings whilst almost all other databases will take the string (delimited with single quotes) and cast it to a datetime value when used against a datetime value field.

So .. don't get caught out when you try datetime values against another databases (not using Jet)!
