I can create a front image of the rack but it would be really helpful if the rack could be rotated and allow a "back" view of the equipment and then setup all the connections. I don't know if other people have a need for a complete 3D image of their drawings, but from an application standpoint this would allow the creation of "complete" drawings instead of a flat front image that
