Please confirm that with the battery installed and power connected that you never see anything on your screen or any lights on to indicate disk activity when you try to power on the machine even if you hold down the power on button for 10 seconds.

Does the "Power-on" light come on? IF so, maybe you have a dead HD (much cheaper problem). IF not, you definitely have a hardware problem.

As I've written, your problem is probably a hardware problem. Take it to be serviced.

BTW, let go of the power button once its been pressed when attempting to boot. And use yer common sense...NO LIGHTS, no power, NO POWER no boot.

Nevertheless, I advise you to take it to be serviced.
(or send it back to the manufacturer if still under warranty).

I'm inclined to agree with Mr. Harper that there may be a hdw problem, particularly in the light of the power cut but nonetheless I suggest you try a Startup Repair if you have the dvd or do a search in the MSKBs for the bootrec tool and use their switches from a cmd prompt outside Windows if you have the Vista DVD.
