Not sure that I am following what you are asking. You have a domain environment, correct. This means that you have at least one Domain Controller. Is this also your File Server, or is that (File Server) being handled by another server? Essentially, it does not really matter.

Simply create a folder, share it, create the local security group, apply the share/ntfs permissions to that and the global or universal security group to that local security group. If you need to do this remotely you can use rmtshare.
