You'll have issues with DNS. After changing the IP address, force A record re-registration using `ipconfig /registerdns`. Remember to also change the IP address of the DNS server. If this is your only DNS your clients will most likely have problems with name resolution since they will still be configured with the old IP address for DNS. If you're using DHCP, change DNS servers option in the scope to the new IP address. Keep in mind that this will take effect at the next refresh interval (at least 50% of lease time). You can force a client refresh with `ipconfig` or by rebooting the client. You might leave the server configured with both IP addresses for some time until all clients pick up the change.

Basically, these are the possible issues, feel free to give more detail on your specific setup so we can give you a more precise answer :)
