For a trust to work you'll need a lot more than just netbios traffic. The BEST way is to use NAT devices (also called routers) that will allow you to set up an IPSec tunnel between networks, otherwise your trust will be more or less useless because Windows PPTP VPNs connect hosts to networks, not networks to networks.

I have seen several posts on the internet claiming that it is not possible to create an external trust between 2 windows server 2003 domains over a NAT device.
