1. On Windows Server 2003, launch GPEDIT.MSC from Start -> Run.
2. Drill down and expand the following for Local Computer Policy:
 - \Computer Configuration
 - \Windows Settings
 - \Security Settings
 - \Local Policies
 - \User Rights Assignment
3. Then confirm that users are added to 'Allow log on through Terminal Services', 'Allow log on locally' and 'Access this computer from the network'.
4. Then confirm that users are NOT added to 'Deny log on through Terminal Services', 'Deny log on locally' and 'Deny access to this computer from the network'

For more information on this subject, once Local Computer Policy (GPEDIT.MSC) is launch then search the Help file for User Rights Assignment.
