Consider that password & user have nothing to do with the INITIAL browsing. (They matter when you try to connect, and usually when you try to get a "share list" after you select a server.)

Can you ping? By name? By number?

Do you have more than one (internal) subnet? If so, do you have WINS server(s)? All all internal machines configured to use that WINS server if you have it or add one?
