Thank you for your response. The ipconfig /all between the different machines reads the same.

One primary difference is that in going into the DNS Server settings on the Server, it does not list the X300s. I tried the regdns command and that didn't seem to have any effect either. I am truly stumped. They do have DHCP active but, all the systems are assigned Static IPs. (I have inherited quite a few rather odd setups from a previous employee, and have been able to correct any incorrect settings to this point.)

I am also having another login issue with one of the X300s. It is now not recognizing any user names or passwords and will not allow me to login locally?... What the heck is up with that? I've tried reinstalling the OS but it fails saying the destination is not accessible. Do you know of a Newsgroup that I may get help with that issue as well?
