>> Services on a domain controller. Here is what Vonid said:

>> [Beginning]  
>> Fax Service runs under the account NETWORK SERVICE. In most cases on  
DC,  
>> such issues happen when applying the domain policy changes the policies  
> that  
>> apply to NETWORK SERVICE. The following policies need to be enabled for  
>> NETWORK SERVICE for fax to work.  
>>  
>> (1) Adjust memory quotas for a process  
>> (2) Generate security audits  
>> (3) Log on as a service  
>> (4) Replace a process level token
