> 1. Go to administrative tools and open the default domain controller > policy

>

> 2. Go to local policies\user rights assignment

>

> 3. Add the account NETWORK SERVICE to the following rights

> Replace a process level token

> Generate security audits

> Adjust memory quotas for a process

> Logon as a service

>

> 4. Add the following accounts to "Generate Security Audits"

>

> Local System

> Administrators

> 5. Do a policy refresh and then test the fax service.
