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JOe,

I am having the exact same problem and its driving me crazy!! I have found that if you use the lpq utility you will find that there are no queues. i.e. I shared a HP Laserjet with a share name of HPLaserJ. When you use the lpq utility it doesn't find the queue. Yet when i set up using the exact same method on a 2k box it works. i have been scouring the net for days looking for a solution for this and I cannot beleive that other people are not experiencing the same problem. I have even re-installed 2k3 on the server to make sure it wasn't a dodgy install. If you find a solution please email me as I will you.

- > We have an AS/400 that is currently printing to a Windows 2000 box using a
- > remote outq. It basically sends an LPR request to a printer share on the
- > windows 2000 box. This works fine.
- >
- > I am trying to set up a second print server, this time using Windows 2003.
- > I change what IP address the AS/400 is sending the print to and have the
- > printers and shares the same but the Windows 2003 box rejects the request. A
- > look at the event log gives this information for each attempt to print:
- >
- > The description for Event ID ( 4008 ) in Source ( LPDSVC ) cannot be found.
- > The local computer may not have the necessary registry information or message
- > DLL files to display messages from a remote computer. You may be able to use
- > the /AUXSOURCE= flag to retrieve this description; see Help and Support for

- > \\192.168.210.146\test, 192.168.3.1.

- > I have verified share case matching.
- >
- > I also did a network monitor and you can see the LPR "Client's command to
- > Daemon" request, looking at it you see the LPR command to "Receive a printer

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- > job" and the correct printer queue name.
- >
- > The server sends its response back "Acknowledgement from Daemon: negative".
- > To me it is obviously rejecting the request but I can not figure out why.
