> | My plan was to expand it memory to 256MB, the maximum for this
> model,
> | IIRC,
> | so I was about to purchase a 128MB expansion module for it. Before
> doing

> | I removed the cover where the RAM module resides. To my surprise I
> found

> | modules in there, so I assume that each is 64MB, but this puts a
> hamper
> | in my
> | plans because I will have to remove one of the modules. This means
> that
> | my
> | RAM expansion will not go from 128MB to 256, rather it will go to
> 192MB.

> | I still have to investigate whether this model will accept different
> | sized modules
> | or whether both modules have to be the same capacity. My question is

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> | whether
> | there is enough performance improvement when 64MB are added to the
> | system
> | to make the RAM expansion (of 64MB more than what it is now) worth
> | it.
