| respective cap symbols). I can use the numeric keypad for those numbers,
| however.

| What's perplexing is that the problem seems to have occurred at the time
| that my Setupapi.log changed.

| The test in the log is as follows:

| \keyboard.inf.
| Changed class GUID of device to {4D36E96B-E325-11CE-BFC1-08002BE10318}.
| Set selected driver.

| I just attached a new keyboard (similar model) and I can use all of the
| above keys. Is it possible that those keys just stopped working, or is
| the change in the above log indicative of spyware or a virus. I ran
| Avast and a bunch of Spyware Programs in addition to crap cleaner. No
| virus was indicated and some spyware was removed, but I still can't seem
| to use the number keys on the old keyboard.

Keyboards fail -- simple as that.
