Since the sys was previously OK you could, in Device Mngr, locate the Raid cntrlr, remove it then reboot. See if that cures it.

> least temporarily disable the SCSI and RAID Controller, to see if that

helps

> the DVD RW, but I see no obvious way to disable the SCSI and RAID Controller.
