The settings that you change thru your ADM are stored in file registry.pol under %systemroot%\system32\GroupPolicy\User and/or %systemroot%\system32\GroupPolicy\Machine. That changes are not removed only by remove your ADM, so what you have to do is load again your ADM and then change you policy settings to Not Configured and then remove your ADM file.
