I tried pinging IP address but still not work. The network status indicator shows there are packets both sent and received. I also use network monitor to capture the packets and it did show the ICMP packets I ping from another machine. The behavior is really like a firewall blocking all inbound connection. What should I do next?

> pinging by IP address rather than by name. Turn on
> your network status indicator in the System Tray and
> watch the send/receive byte counters while you ping –
> they will tell you plenty.
