What rights you assign the account names doesn't matter – the NAMES and PASSWORDS are what need to match up between the two computers. If you log onto one PC with the name "Garry" and a password of "lost", then the computer you want to access over the network must have a user with the same name, and password, and with rights to the folders you want to access.

> obvious (to you) but I'm pretty sure a lack of expertise in a given area  
> is why the majority of people use newsgroups to find the answers to  
> problems (or the starting point for them) from those with more experience.

> has been set to assume everyone logs on as Administrator" and "The user  
> accounts on the XP machine are Owner and Networker, both of which are

- > thought that would be a reserved or system generated ID.
