I mean a user name acceptable to the other PCs, not necessarily the one that is logged in on any of them. It seems like it avoids certain glitches with windows integral authentication. However I think you should check your network settings to see if that machine is using NetBIOS over TCP/IP... see if changing the setting there works. It is in the "WINS" tab of the properties. Default usually works but maybe positively switching it on will make a difference.

OK. Yes I have such a username. But I will check it again.
About NetBIOS over TCP/IP – yes I have it.
I have checked the settings over and over again, and if I'm not blind they are nearly identical on both PC 1 and PC2 (computer name, ip address etc differs of course).

I know what you mean about not being blind but sometimes you can look too hard and still not see it :)

Another reason for the username I mentioned is that there are two sets of permissions with sharing, actual sharing permissions and also the NTFS permissions on the folders being shared. If Netbeui enables viewing though I can't see folder permissions being the problem.

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Have you tried going to network places from scratch, in other words from "Entire Network" and all the way down? I am assuming that's what you are doing but I've seen network places get confused also.

I did notice that you picked the IP address 1 for this machine. That's often used by default for routers, I just wonder if that has anything to do with anything? You can more easily view folder permissions (On the machine sharing the folder) by opening a folder, tools>folder options>view and uncheck simple file sharing. Other than that I think my brain has seized up, will be back later... :)
