> I have a problem with a SBS2000, Win2k = SP4, Exchange = SP3, ISA = SP1.
> The server is being used as a mail/internet server.
>
> There is no internet traffic possible. When checking the logs, there are a
couple of services that don't start. These are Remote Acces Connection
Manager, ISA Server Control, WebProxy, Firewall and Scheduled Cache Content
Download-service.
>
> The first error is:
>
> Remote Access Connection Manager failed to start because it could not
register with the local security authority. Restart the computer. Incorrect
function.
> This has eventid 20033.
>
> Since this service doesn't start, the other services failed to start.
These have event id 7023 (service control) and 7001 (for ISA, Proxy,
Firewall, Cache Content).
> When I try to start a service, I get a message like (translated from
dutch):
>
> Microsoft Management Console:
> Cannot start <servicename> on local computer.
> Error 1068: independant-service- or group cannot be started.
>
> The log is full within an half hour, with error messages about rasctrs
(eventid 2001), perflib (eventid 1010 or 1008), Rasman (eventid 20033) and
service control (eventid 7023)
>
> I'm able to ping to external ip-adresses and websites.
> Also, the email works without problems (internal and external).
> The server is connected to the internet by an ISDN-router.
>
