Hi Steven,

I suggest you trace the registry and check to see what permissions needed to install the hotbar in Internet Explorer for the terminal users. You may remove the write permission on the related registry for the terminal users to prevent them installing the hotbar. You can trace the registry using Advanced Registry Tracer or Regmon.
