Lilian, removing the temporary license from the client will not help you. In fact, it will cause you to loose the last 3 days of your temporary license.

The fact that the other clients don't show this warning is completely logical, since they just received their temporary license, and will be able to connect with it for 90 days. Then they will receive the same warning, and eventually be refused to connect.

There is **no** way that you can connect with any client to a 2003 TS without a 2003 TS Licensing Server, which has 2003 TS CALs installed on it, for longer than 90 days.

Did you ever read the FAQ I mentioned?
