No. The Cookies, however, are deleted seperately and so you can empty the Internet cache ("Delete Files") without deleting the Cookies. You cannot make Cookies permanent, so that they are not deleted when you wipe all the data. You have to erase all unwanted Cookies manually for to do this.

Check if a Password keeper is helpful for you. You can then logon to your password protected sites on an easy way and store the login data in a safe manner.

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
