Is this on your machine? If so, it should read as closed. The bank is running a web server and it should be open for them. <https://> is how the site should start, the key being the 's' indicating a secured site. Just make sure the lock icon is displayed in the status bar (if it's not on, click view/status bar) when you are visiting the site.
