>> then click Local Security Policy.
>> 2. Expand Local Policies.
>> 3. Click User Rights Assignment.
>> 4. Double-click to open the Impersonate a client after authentication
>> policy
>> 5. On the Local Security Settings tab, click Add User or Group, and then
>> add the Administrator and Service to the list of Users and Groups.
>> 6. Click OK, and then restart the computer.
>>
>> The problem is my Local Security Policy does not have an –Impersonate a
>> client after authentication policy– to chage! Any ideas. I am running XP
>> Pro SP1 as I can't upgrade to sp2?!?
