Do we have any registry experts in the house?

I'm trying to make the CD Player that comes with W2K the default player for .cda files (music CDs) on my computer. I used to run W2K and so I copied that application (CDPlayer.exe) onto my XP partition, but the registry tweak I made isn't working for some reason. The player opens up fine when I double click on the shortcut, but it doesn't auto-play when I pop in a music CD.

These are the 3 changes I made thus far:

HKEY_CLASSES_ROOT\.cda\OpenWithList\
Added a subkey for 'CDPlayer.exe'

HKEY_CLASSES_ROOT\cdafile\shell\play\command
Changed the default value to: %SystemRoot%\system32\CDPlayer.exe "%L", /Play

When this didn't work, I added a subkey 'CDPlayer.exe' under:

HKEY_LOCAL_MACHINE\SOFTWARE\Classes\Applications

None of this has worked thus far. What have I missed? I'm completely stumped.
