Yes, that is correct.

I can boot from the WinXPe CD and both cards are detected and configured for dhcp. Network is fine since I can map a network drive & ping.

Ipconfig /all works fine also (shows correct addresses).

I even created a netsh dump file using "netsh interface ip dump >staticIP.txt". *It shows both NICs configured for dhcp.*

Without touching the PC, so the hardware is unchanged, I boot to my run-time image and I get the above situations.

I am running CMD-shell, so I assume I do not have a device manager, correct?

One thing I'd like to note is that I can ping loopback (127.0.0.1) successfully in my run-time image. I found a similar posting in this Newsgroup that refereed to this. That insinuates that my TCP/IP stack is installed correctly, no? If so, then it looks to be interface related.
