Lars,

Even though MS has removed MS Java download from www.microsoft.com a long while ago, it is still available on Internet.

You seemed to have found it anyway.

It is absolutely unclear to me why you see msjava.dll in the list of dependencies of TAImporter.dll. It should not be there (and it is not there on my machine).

You can certainly get the Full XPe ToolKit Package from an XPe distributor (e.g., BSquare Corp, www.bsquare.com).

But it will unlikely help you. There is very slight differences between Eval and Full version and no differences (except text) in installations.

Also, just in case check what version of WSH you've got. It better be 5.6.

And one more thought, have you tried to download the Eval kit again? Maybe you got broken bits last time.
