> > *The uninstall probably requires a reboot so it can delete the file that*
is
> > *inuse. Did the uninstall not have you do a reboot? Otherwise, how*
would
> > *your system stop using their driver (in memory) and then switch to using*
> > *the*
> > *standard VGA driver (or whatever Windows detects to use for its embedded*
> > *drivers)? If you rebooted and let Windows do its auto detection of*
"new"
> > *hardware, I would think it would see the nVidia device and then install*
> > *the*
> > *Windows-supplied drivers for it, any maybe those include the service you*
> > *are*
> > *talking about. So boot into Safe mode for Windows. That should force*
the
> > *use of the standard VGA driver. Then install you new drivers for the*
new
> > *video card.*
