> *I can ping a public IP from the Windows 2000 Pro machine*

> *but cannot from the Windows XP machine. I can ping the*

> *Windows 2000 machine from the XP machine, but not Windows*

> *2000 to XP machine.*

> *How can I make the Windows 2000 Pro ping the XP machine*

> *and how do I get the Internet going on the XP Pro*

> *machine. The Win2000 Pro machine can browse the web OK.*

> *Both machines are simply connected to a LAN.*
