> *for Server 2000.*

It's no different...

> *thereafter delete the user in SBS 2003 and then re-create it? Will it*

> *solve the issue?*

Not necessary. So, you took ownership as Administrators, right? Now you can go to the security tab, and add the permissions you want....what folder did you take ownership of – just your own profile subfolder? Permissions should be Administrators & System & youraccount=full control. Then in advanced, apply to all subfolders.
