> Controller" and the modem. I do not see a modem in the device manager and
> there is still a question mark by the PCI Controller.
> I took the modem out and reseated it hoping it had shook loose during
> shipping but that didnt help.
> Is the PCI Controller the same as the modem? The modem had LGLUCENT on the
> chip but no modem is installed.
> I have browsed the Motherboard CD and didn't see any files or folders with
> the PCI Controller.
> I am wondering if I should reinstall the restore CD using winnt32.exe this
> time, maybe it missed something? The CD instructions says if I put the CD
> in the drive and restart the computer it will start the process of
> restoring the system. That hasn't worked either. Did i mention this was a
> Wintergreen system and the software says Famous Maker?

>> Well, the motherboard CD contains what you need to get rid of those
>> BANGS! in Device Manager. They mean no driver is installed for them, so
>> they aren't functioning correctly. Install them one at a time.

>> Removing the unwanted line at boot is simple. Go to the Control
>> Panel/System/Advanced tab, click on startup and recovery settings. In the
>> upper part of the settings, click the edit button, this will open
>> boot.ini in notepad for you. Remove the unwanted line from the [operating

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>> systems] section. Click file/save and close. This is an example of a
>> normal boot.ini, with Windows on C: as the system partition:

>> [boot loader]
>> timeout=3
>> default=multi(0)disk(0)rdisk(0)partition(1)\WINDOWS
>> [operating systems]
>> multi(0)disk(0)rdisk(0)partition(1)\WINDOWS="Microsoft Windows XP
>> Professional" /fastdetect /NoExecute=OptIn

>> That last piece about "/NoExecute=OptIn" will only be there if SP2 is
>> installed.
