> Well, I don't know about other options, but you might try
> the filemon utility from sysinternals at <http://www.sysinternals.com>
> You start it with admin priv. from the users account (use runas to do
> that).
> You can then see what files are trying to be opened/accessed and where it
> is getting the "denied" message from. Then you can fix that problem.
> I just went through that with a game of my sons that insisted you needed
> admin priv "to access the file" with no hint of what file it was -- turned
> out to be two files in two folders down in the game directory. Give
> that a shot -- free and a handy utility to have around (he also has one

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> called "regmon" that will tell you what/when something is changing the
> registry. Hopefully this will point you in the right direction.
