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Believe the browser the install is talking about is windows explorer for browsing the contents of your PC. The option to install or not install winzip to piggyback windows explorer is in the custom install option after its selected.

The "exe" setup file automatically unzips the contents and begins the setup installation.

Licensing and usage are application dependent. Read the license.

> During the installation process, I wasn't asked to unzip or extract or choose a browser. I \*don't\* see Winzip on my laptop—for years I've used it

> on my desktop computers—I think it was bundled. My two questions are:

>

> 1. was there possibly a Windows XP zip program that automatically did the extracting?

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> 2. if I purchase a new WinZip program for my desktop computer, will I be able to use it on my networked laptop, too?
