Today I noticed some folders on my system that I could not open when clicking on them. I got "Access is Denied" when trying to open certain folders. Some folders were created just a week ago and I was using them to store some files in for a short time. I am able to right-click the problem folders to view properties and when clicking on "Security" I receive a message "You do not have permission to view or edit the current permission settings for (folder name), but you can take ownership or change auditing settings."

Most folders that this happens to are ones that I have made and are located directly under c:\ but there are some such as the I386 folder that denies me access too. I did a system restore back from over a week ago and I still have the problem. Does anyone have any explanation as to what caused this?
