I just got this neat device that lets me play my MP3 files on my stereo, it's an RCA Lyra RD900W wireless transmitter/receiver and though it works great, everytime I use it I have to make some changes to my sound settings. Since it acts like a virtual sound card, I first have to go to control panel/sounds and audio devices and select it instead of my normal Soundblaster sound card, then I have to open Windows Media Player (my preferred player) and change the audio device there too. What I'm wondering is if I can record a macro and assign it to a Hot key so that all I have to do is press it and have these changes done automatically? Actually I would like two Hot keys programmed, one to make the changes and one to put things back the way they were.

I'm no computer genius and I've never done any programming, but if it's as simple as recording a series of mouse clicks, I can probably handle that. Is it that simple, do I need some program to do this?
