[[SYMPTOMS

When you try to start Microsoft Management Console (MMC) with a snap-in on a Microsoft Windows XP-based computer, MMC may not start and you may receive the following error message:

MMC cannot open Snap-in Name. This may be because the file does not exist, is not an MMC console, or was created with a later version of MMC. This may also be because you do not have sufficient access rights to the file.

Note In this error message, Snap-in Name is a placeholder for the name of the MMC snap-in file, such as Compmgmt.msc.

CAUSE

This problem may occur when the following conditions are true:

- * You configure the user of the %APPDATA% folder or you configure the system environment variable to point to a location that is not available, such as a network
- * The Offline Files feature is turned off on your Windows XP-based computer.

WORKAROUND

To work around this problem, turn on the Offline Files feature on your
