then

|>dynamically upates itself (which is what I would expect). However, Group
|>Deletions (in Either Instancees) reported the same message. So, being a
|>diligent as possible, I went to the Second Instance of Search, re-ran it
and
|>the file list was identical to the First Instance.

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>In the First Instance, I deleted a file – the Second Instance updated
>Dynamically. BUT, "Group Deletes" still report the same error.
