Seems to me there should be a way to set up a limited user account with no network configuration and then simply not allow them to change that, but I'm more of a unix guy than windows guy so am not sure where to look...

McAfee Privacy (www.mcafee.com) gives the Administrator, in this case, the parent the right to list different users. Each user will have different access to the computer and this can include no Internet access, I believe, – or can limit the usage to specific times.

Each user (children and adults) will be given a userid and password. Of course, it depends on the Administrator and the adults keeping their passwords secret from the children.

Took a look, but all it seems to allow is content filtering/blocking, not outright denial. Do you know for a fact it does this? That would be exactly what they want if it really worked...
