All users in my Active Directory domain have a home folder configured in AD to automatically attach their z: drive to \\server\home\username where home is the name of the share on the server.

Frequently when clients login to the domain from XP Pro computers

that have just been rebooted, their z: drive gets mapped to \\server\home instead of \\server\home\username. If they logout and

login again, the mapping is correct. This only happens on XP. All

2000 Pro clients always get mapped correctly.
