I am finding often when I have changed a filename within a folder I am then unable to rename the folder that contains it. It even seems if I merely Copy the filename text, to past it elsewhere, then the folder containing that file cannot be renamed. Only if I then reboot can I rename that folder.

I note that all my folders have a Read Only attribute, but as my other PC's do aswell I assume this is normal.

The read only setting for folders is ignored by windows. Folders are always open for reading. Actually it's not set to read only. There are three states for it. It's actually in an indeterminate state. You can see the three states for clicking on the box and seeing how it cycles.
