Hi,

Turn off simple file sharing in Explorer / Tools / Folder Options / View (tab). (Uncheck the last item.)

Connecting to the root of the C drive is a bad thing as you can run stuff in program files that will mess up the registry of the machine you are connecting from. So take care there.

The PC you are connecting to will only trust Everyone it knows about. Not Everyone on this planet. So you need to connect with a set of credentials that the sharing PC knows about. (User/password).
