I did it, and in my case, SymNRT gave me a message telling that "This version has expired, please download the newest one" (or similar), and refused to work. And it was just downloaded from their site!!!!!!

Did you download and run the file named SymNRT.exe, this is the tool that will remove most of the registry entries and files on your hard disk. Unfortunately the more recent versions of this file do not remove all the registry entries like the earlier versions did so their will still be a few reg entries you most likely not be able to find and delete.

As for any remaining directories and files you may be required to reboot before you can delete these.
