Are they two drives or one drive divided into two partitions. You can see which in Disk Management. If two drives they be labelled Disk 0 and Disk 1 If a single drive divided into two it will be Disk 0 with one under Status showing as Healthy (System) and the other as Healthy.

Go to Start, Control Panel, Folder Options, View, Advanced Settings and verify that the box before "Show hidden files and folders" is checked and "Hide protected operating system files " is unchecked. You may need to scroll down to see the second item. You should also make certain that the box before "Hide extensions for known file types" is not checked. Next in Windows Explorer make sure View, Details is selected and then select View, Choose Details and check before Name, Type, Total Size, and Free Space.

Now see if you see the Recycler folder. They are sub-folders of the partition e.g. c:\Recycler.
