Anyone know of a quick way of determining what is causing SideBySide errors that are reported in Event Viewer? Computer is a Dell laptop, Inspiron 1150, running Windows XP Media Center.

Have scanned the computer with anti-virus, anti-adware and anti-spyware. Eliminated some minor adware and spyware that were detected but errors continue to be reported. Does not list application(s) involved. Thinking of re-installing Windows XP Media Center on the thought that user could have sucked in some persistent malware that is drawing on the resources within \Windows\WinSxS.
