upgrade which I downloaded and installed. I set a Restore point before the install.

Everything seemed okay with the install and I ran clean ups on Windows, Applications and the Registry. I have done all three in the past many times with no problems. I also saved the registry entry backup to my desktop before the final deletion of the registry changes. I have two such entries on my desktop now.

Once all the cleanup was done, I right-clicked on a text file I have on my desktop and the following message appeared,

Windows Explorer has encountered a problem and needs to close. We are sorry for the inconvenience .

If I right-click on another item immediately after receiving that message, then the Active Desktop Recovery occurs with this message

Microsoft Windows has experienced an unexpected error. As a precaution your active desktop has been turned off. To restore follow these troubleshooting tips".

I am able to restore using one of the tips.

I used my System Restore
