Hi,

Even I am facing the same problem after I connected a Wireless Adapter to the USB port on my HP Pavilion Notebook. I have Windows XP Home Edition installed on my laptop.

The Wireless adapter was installed successfully and was working fine till I restarted the machine. On restart, the system would not proceed further to Bios with the Adapter connected to the USB. I have removed the adapter and it asked me for a safe boot or normal boot for which I selected normal boot. Then it would get stuck up at the Windows XP logo for sometime and display an error message indicating the program 'HPWirelessMgr.exe' has tried referencing a memory location at 0x00000000. Click OK to close the program or cancel to debug the program.

I have tried both the options but the login page would not appear.

Please let me know any solution to this problem.
