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card including the latest ones(Winfast FX5200). I have updated bios and chipset drivers of motherboard (GA BX2000+). I tried to configure BIOS settings of motherboard, but unfortunately VgaSave is still running. I am really tired and thinking to post this hardware problem to Microsoft!
