Flash the mobo BIOS need to have some PC skills and you must really understand how to do it as an improper update of BIOS may turn your PC to a dead stone and the repair charges may be expensive.

Pls refer to the mobo user manual if it is a home made PC or refer to the owner manual for a brand name PC.

BTW, You should obtain the latest VIA drivers from viaarena.com or from the mobo manufacturer's website but not from windows.
