> HKEY_LOCAL_MACHINE\SYSTEM\ControlSet001\Enum\BTHENUM\

> I am using XP Home so I cannot access ports through Device Manage (even by
> selecting show all hidden devices and using different views).
>
> Anyone know how to delete these port assignments?
